Sauvignon Blanc wines are the fastest-growing white wine category in the US. Demand from Millennials and Gen Z wine drinkers is rapidly pushing it to the forefront, and it may soon supplant Chardonnay as America's favorite white wine. Here's a selection of 15 California Sauvignon Blanc wines, which have won gold medals in multiple international competitions, all retailing, according to Wine-Searcher for an average price of approximately \$30 or less.

In compiling this list of top-rated Sauvignon Blancs, we reviewed the results from various wine competitions, including Decanter World Wine Awards, Wine Spectator, International Wine & Spirit Competition, San Francisco International Wine Competition, San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition, Wine Enthusiast, and Concours Mondial de Bruxelles.

The Sauvignon Blanc grape is among the most well-known and widely planted white wine varieties globally. The grape is probably a descendant of Savagnin Blanc from France's Jura region. Its name, "Sauvignon," is derived from the French words for "wild" (sauvage) and "white" (blanc), reflecting the grape's likely origins as a wild vine.

While indigenous to France and widely cultivated in Bordeaux and the Loire valley, the variety has found significant success in other regions, particularly New Zealand, Australia, and California, where it thrives in cooler climates but has adapted well to warmer growing conditions. Sauvignon Blanc can vary significantly in style, with cool-climate wines being crisp and herbaceous, while warm-region wines take on a more tropical profile.

Sauvignon Blanc is known for its aromatic intensity, crisp acidity, and fresh, herbaceous qualities. The grape typically produces wines that range from light and refreshing to more full-bodied and complex, depending on the climate, winemaking techniques, and terroir. The grape is often used to produce dry wines and sweeter late-harvest and botrytized dessert wines, but its dry, crisp expression is the most widely appreciated.

California, particularly warmer regions like Napa Valley, Sonoma County, and Mendocino, produces a distinctive style of Sauvignon Blanc. These wines are often characterized by a unique balance of tropical fruit flavors, herbaceousness, and bright, tangy acidity. The warmer climate in California compared to France tends to yield riper fruit flavors, but winemakers often use techniques such as stainless-steel fermentation or lees aging to preserve the wine's freshness and aromatic intensity.

Sauvignon Blanc wines are typically pale straw to light gold with a clear and bright appearance.

The nose is aromatic and expressive, with characteristic citrus notes such as grapefruit, lime, and lemon. There are often herbaceous qualities, such as gooseberry, fresh-cut grass, or green bell pepper. In some cases, tropical fruit notes like passionfruit, pineapple, and melon emerge, especially in warmer climates like Napa Valley. Wines that undergo some oak aging may also present subtle hints of vanilla or smoke.

On the palate, Sauvignon Blanc typically offers crisp acidity that provides a refreshing, mouth-cleansing sensation. The wine's fruit flavors are clean and vibrant, ranging from citrusy to tropical, depending on the terroir. They may feature a subtle herbal or grassy quality, balancing the fruitiness. Some wines also show a slight minerality or salinity, particularly those from cooler coastal regions like California's Sonoma Coast.

The finish is usually crisp and refreshing, with lingering flavors of citrus, melon, or even a touch of herbaceousness and a slight tangy zest.

Sauvignon Blanc is a versatile wine that pairs well with a variety of dishes, particularly those with fresh, vibrant flavors. It is an excellent accompaniment to oysters, shrimp, or grilled fish. It also pairs well with cheese, particularly tangy ones like fresh goat cheese or feta, and compliments vegetarian dishes and salads with citrus-based dressings.

Duckhorn Sauvignon Blanc - Napa Valley \$29

Duckhorn Vineyards produces complex, vibrant Sauvignon Blanc. The wine features citrus zest of lemon and lime, melon, and tropical fruit notes with a bright, crisp finish.

Frog's Leap Sauvignon Blanc - Napa Valley \$29

<u>Frog's Leap</u> is a pioneer of organic farming, creating fresh, terroir-driven wines. The wine features grapefruit, lemon, and subtle grassiness with lively acidity and a refreshing finish.

Groth Sauvignon Blanc - Napa Valley \$27

<u>Groth</u> produces estate-grown wines with a focus on showcasing Napa Valley terroir. The wine features notes of melon, citrus, and a hint of minerality with a clean, refreshing finish.

Honig Vineyard & Winery, Sauvignon Blanc - Napa Valley \$23

Honig focuses on sustainable practices, producing bright, fruit-forward wines. The wine features grapefruit, kiwi, and lemongrass with refreshing acidity and a clean finish.

Matanzas Creek Sauvignon Blanc - Sonoma County \$20

Murrieta's Well The Whip - Livermore Valley \$23

One of California's oldest wineries, Murrieta's Well blends Sauvignon Blanc with other varietals for complexity. The wine features citrus, melon, and a touch of tropical fruit with a crisp, mineral-driven finish.

Rodney Strong Charlotte's Home Sauvignon Blanc - Sonoma County \$15
